Year 6

In English, we wrote cinquain poems which have a structure of 2 syllables for the first line, 4 syllables for the second line, 6 syllables for the third line, 8 syllables for the fourth line and then 2 syllables for the last line.

On slips of paper we wrote a topic, e.g. poppies, then a description, e.g. scarlet, blood-red, then an action, e.g. swaying in the wind, dancing. On the penultimate slip, we wrote down our feelings/thoughts about the subject, e.g. the men laid poppies row on row, and finally we wrote a conclusion slip, e.g. hope, love. By Max M













Year 5

To create a piece of art for our Remembrance Day assembly, we took the work of Georgia O'Keeffe as our inspiration and made poppy pictures that fill the frame of the piece. We sketched the petals of our poppies, ensuring they overlapped the edge of the paper. Then, using a red wash, we used watercolour paint to lay on the first paint tone. Using less water in the mix, we then added darker shades to add shadow and give the flowers a 3D effect. Our finished work is to be combined to make a class wreath of poppies.



Year 4

This week in Science, Year 4 have started looking at Solids, Liquids and Gases. We started by grouping objects under the correct heading based on what we thought we knew. We then learnt about some of the properties of solids, liquids and gases before looking at how the particles are arranged.


We then did a fun experiment involving raisins and lemonade. First, we predicted what would happen when we dropped the raisin into the lemonade. Most of us thought that the raisin would sink as it is a solid and heavier than the lemonade.

We were amazed at what actually happened, even though the raisin initially sunk, the gas bubbles in the lemonade stuck to the solid raisin and lifted it up through the liquid lemonade!















Year 3

This week we learnt about the different jumps and how to do these safely, both on the floor and off a piece of apparatus. We learnt about bending our knees and how to support our balance when landing. Once we worked through the different types of jump, we worked on combining these into a sequence with a partner using a bench and mat. Lots of us remembered the balances we did last week and used these to inspire us. Our favourite part was showing everyone our finished sequences.














Year 2


