#### Year 6

The children have been exploring stories of Hinduism in R.E this term. They explored the 'Sesame Scholar' and the 'Fruit of Service' stories this week. After a discussion about both stories, the children decided that the messages both stories gave were:

- if you do not put any effort into what you do you will not achieve success
- if you work hard, you will be rewarded but if you are too greedy you could lose everything.

The children then thought about something they wanted to get better at. They were given a stone as a promise to themselves to work hard on this task. A representation of their promise was then painted on the stone. When they have achieved their goal, they can take the stone home!









#### Year 5

This week in English, we have continued to study Shakespeare's play Macbeth. We recreated the infamous Banquo Banquet scene and the children really showed off their dramatic skills. As a class, we read the scene and discussed the Shakespearean language used. The children then analysed what the guests and other characters must have been feeling watching Macbeth descend into madness. The children then recreated and acted out the scene. Year 5 definitely has some potential Oscar winners in its midst!







#### Year 4

Year 4 have finally removed their mummified tomatoes from their natron substance. We found that the tomatoes' weight had decreased by at least half, if not more. The tomato was very wrinkly and shrivelled where the liquid from the tomato had been drawn out by the natron.

We were curious to know what might have happened if we left the tomato for the full amount of time so we predicted what would happen.













#### Year 3

This week we applied our learning about 3D shapes to make our own for our classroom display. We used nets to build them and then filled in each face with a different fact about that shape's properties. For example, we wrote how many faces it had, how many edges, how many vertices and if there were any other key features like the number of right angles.













#### Year 2

This week in Maths we have started learning all about position and directions. We have been mastering our left and right with videos and dances and have been practising following directions using fairground maps in the hall. We then gave directional instructions to the bee bots to further secure our understanding.


















#### Year 1

This week in Maths our focus has been on fractions. We have learnt how to half and quarter shapes and numbers. We know that to half and quarter a number it must be an even number as otherwise our counters cannot be distributed equally between the circles. We had to apply our knowledge of number to be able to work with fractions. We had to be careful when we were counting up how many counters/dots we had placed in each circle, otherwise our answer was incorrect. We know that to half a number, you divide it by two and to quarter a number, you divide it by four.











#### **Early Years**

This week Early Years have been sowing fresh tomato seeds (to go with our bean and pea seeds) to plant in our outside area. We also have strawberries and mint to start us off on our new sensory planter! Next week we will be planting sunflowers, summer wild flowers, peppers, pumpkins and potatoes to add to our gardening adventures!

Our tomato planting linked with our computing skills of algorithms because we ordered the pictorial sequence of events that we needed to do to plant them successfully. We looked at the planting seeds images and put them into order. We created an algorithm – a set of very simple instructions to show how to plant a seed. The algorithm is broken down (decomposed) into steps in a particular sequence. The instructions were:

1. Find a pot; 2. Put some soil in it; 3. Push the seed into the soil; 4. Add water; 5. Put it in the light and wait; 6. Watch it grow!














We have also been extending our growing topic stories: Jack and the Beanstalk, Jasper's Beanstalk and Jim and the Beanstalk, into our Maths learning. Nursery children have been counting with beans.











Reception children have been investigating and reasoning with measurement Maths They have used a variety of resources including socks (large and small), peas, beans, cubes as well as experimenting with rulers, metre sticks and metre wheels to measure themselves and leaf pictures. They have also ordered and made ascending sized towers. They have even been estimating and seeing if they were right too!













We visited the music studio to accompany the Jack and the Beanstalk story. We used the Glockenspiels to make music from low to high as Jack climbed up the Beanstalk and from high to low when he went back down again. We also practised beating in rhythm to a different Fee
